YTD Attendance: 89% dropped 2% from last month, took a hit for thanksgiving break, vacations and such. booking trips prior to school being closed. It is vital for children to come to school everyday, as much as they can. Days do count toward absenteeism.

Chronic Absenteeism last meeting 33%, this meeting 41% we want this number to be as low as possible!!



Instructional Focus:

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
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Our BGES Theory of Action is directly aligned to District 19's Theory of Action, which is to ensure a focused direction to collaboratively improve student outcomes. This school year, we are working to have strong instructional practices in place. For example, we have asked ourselves, how can the principal support our teachers in their instruction?, and what do our teachers need to successfully teach their students? We are putting an equally strong focus on our student learning outcomes as a whole.

Our staff is currently engaged in high-quality professional development around the Science of Reading, successful implementation of Wit & Wisdom (our English Language Arts curriculum), and monitoring of high quality teaching and learning. Teachers are engaged in literacy blocks during their teacher teams. They have been exploring data and gaining knowledge of what their students need in order to expose them to new skills and content.

#### D19 Pillars:



There are currently 36 schools in District 19. All 36 schools are currently aligned with the same, shared curricula. We use Eureka Math, Wit & Wisdom, Amplify Science, and Passport Social Studies.

**Pillar One:** Both BGES and District 19 have put a focus on strengthening core instruction. With teachers engaged in professional learning, it will allow them to expand their knowledge of how to teach. We have also

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shifted from the Common Core State Standards to the New York State Next Generation Standards.


**Pillar Two:** Building a sense of belonging and trust allows scholars to take ownership of their learning in the classroom.

**Pillar Three:** Adult learning matters! We have planned, and are continuing to plan workshops for families that are founded around our core curricula. We **STRONGLY** encourage our BGES families to attend workshops. These opportunities to participate in workshops ensure that families are learning alongside students and teachers.

**Pillar Four:** Continuous improvement is being heavily tracked this year through progress monitoring. Parent Teacher Conferences are coming up in November! At this point in the school year, baseline data for students has been established. We encourage you to touch base with your child's teachers to "check the pulse" of their academic updates.

This school year, WE ARE WINNING!!! We are setting the foundation to WIN! Win is an acronym that stands for **What 'do' I Need** in school to be prepared for learning. Students need motivation and ownership to feel successful in their learning daily.

# Theories of Action:



Currently, District 19's Instructional Focus is around Productive Struggle. Our BGES Instructional Focus for the 2023-2024 school year is closely aligned to the District's. **Productive Struggle is a method in how we engage students in opportunities of academic discourse and self-efficacy.** There is a big difference between struggle and productive struggle. We do not want our scholars to reach the point of frustration, however, we do want them to learn how to use strategies and skills to work through challenges.

MTSS: Multi-Tiered Student Support

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This school year, we are focused on citing textual evidence and evidence of productive struggle. Our teachers are engaged in professional development focused on improving their practice, building leadership capacity, strengthening core instruction, planning core curricula implementations with appropriate scaffolds, and improving student outcomes. We want to ensure that our scholars are receiving support, especially in the areas of literacy and written responses. Our scholars in grades 3, 4, and 5 will be taking state tests this year, so we are really focusing on these skills!

If teachers design tasks that include opportunities for productive struggle with complex texts, then students are able to identify strategies that work best for them to lead to success.

We are working towards MASTERY with our Next Generation Standards! Our teachers are deeply engaging in this practice and we see evidence in our classrooms every single day. We want to continue to see evidence of productive struggle and students citing contextual evidence and working towards mastery with their literacy goals.

# Attendance Update:



We are two months into our school year already! We just want to shout out to those who attended school on

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September 29, the day of the really bad rainstorm!! Thank you families for getting our scholars to school! We had rallies and scholars were given incentives. We truly express our gratitude.

Current Year to Date Attendance Rate: 91%

- Our attendance rate did not change from last month, which is great! Our rate DID NOT drop!
   Current Citywide Attendance Rate: 93%
  - We are still in GOOD STANDING!!


We want our Chronic Absenteeism to be as low as possible. I am happy to say that our chronic absenteeism rate **dropped from 37% (last gathering) to 33%!!** Remember that without coming to school, your scholars cannot learn!

# **Attendance Categories Update:**

Attendance letters are being mailed to families to show where your child stands in regard to attendance. As stated before, we are two months into our school year and we want to ensure that everyone knows where their child's attendance rate falls in regards to attendance categories. If your scholar falls in a yellow or red attendance category, we are prioritizing mailing your student letters. We want to try and improve their attendance rates! All families will be receiving a letter, regardless of attendance category. The letter will include a graphic and detailed report about where your child stands. We are hoping to send these letters home monthly. If you have any questions or concerns regarding your scholars attendance, you can contact Mr. Daniel.

# S-CEP Update:



We are finally putting a close on last school year's S-CEP. There are so many great things that we would like to highlight with our results! First, it is very rare for a school to meet state defined CEP goals because the numbers are based on algorithms that are challenging to achieve. We are happy to say that we MET and

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
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SURPASSED our English Language Arts goal by 2%!!! Our math goal is still approaching, however, we want to point out that we only missed this goal by 3 STUDENTS!!

School Data Report:



Our School Data Report finally was released to the public today! BGES, we are WINNING all the way up and beyond! The data above shows students who received a level 3 or 4 on their state exams. A level 3 signifies a student performing on grade level and a level 4 is a student exceeding grade level expectations.

**English Language Arts:** We had a 27% increase from the 2022 school year to the 2023 school year! Our scholars jumped from 10% to 37% proficiency!

**Mathematics:** We had a 28% increase from the 2022 school year to the 2023 school year! Our scholars jumped from 8% to 36% proficiency!

Out of 36 schools in our district, 10 schools made the Top Ten Schools with the most gains. Not only did BGES make the top 10 list, we are #1 IN BOTH ELA AND MATH!!!

Parents have access to their scholar's individual reports on NYCSA.

We have made AMAZING gains!! I can see us growing again with our instructional focus! We are #1 in the district for improvements. We have almost **tripled** gains in both ELA and Math in one year. That is rare citywide and a major accomplishment! We applaud everyone and the efforts we have put in together. Let's keep pushing with momentum! We are expecting 100% participation on the state tests this year! Opting out of the exams is doing harm to your scholars' academic gains and it makes it challenging for schools to show gains.

We also wanted to highlight that this year we had incredible gains with our students with disabilities. One 4th grade student from last year in particular went from a 1.36 to a 4.08!

## **NYCSA Activation:**

- IMPORTANT: If you do not have an activated account, it will be hard to see your scholar's scores, report cards, request school verification letters, access middle school applications, access documents related to your scholar, etc.
- Currently there are 314 scholars enrolled at BGES, however only 50% of accounts have been activated.
- If a child has two parents listed on their registration card, BOTH PARENTS must have an account activated. The system is designed this way so that both parents have access to their child's education.
- If you are unsure of your account status, call Ms. Nadine or Mr. Keith for support. Labs are open with Ms. Nadine between 9:00 and 11:00 am to activate accounts.
- Parent Teacher Conferences are **November 2, 2023**. Without an account, you cannot get a printed report card for your scholar.
- NYS ELA/Math State Exam scores can be accessed via the NYCSA portal.

# Google Classroom Usage:

Google Classrooms have been created by your scholars' teachers using their student NYC DOE email addresses. You can find your scholar's email address on NYCSA. Please note they need to use their NYC DOE email address, not their BGES email address! If you are unsure of your child's DOE email address, please contact the school so we can assist you. These emails will be used daily for internal students who use online learning platforms to assist in performance in school and will be used during remote learning days (or school closures), similar to pandemic and remote learning. Remote learning is not going away! We are not replacing traditional learning styles, but enhancing them. Schools will not be closed for snow days. We will have remote days! ALL STUDENTS must have their Google Classroom accounts activated.

## **Early Childhood Education Afterschool Program:**

- Will be hosted from Tuesday to Thursday weekly.
- Selected families will begin on October 24, 2023.
- Only 10 slots in each cycle
- We do not want to exhaust or overwork scholars in afterschool, especially at such a young age!

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## BGES Afterschool (Grades 3, 4, & 5):

- Begins October 24th and will be offered Tuesdays through Thursdays
- Support students in New York Edge to have time in academics to further support students and momentum.

Meeting Welcome:



Welcome families to our first SLT Town Hall Meeting for the 2023-2024 school year! We would like to proudly introduce our new leadership members, Mr. Keith Rogers (SLT ChairPerson), Ms. Amanda Rosado (SLT Secretary), and Mr. Daniel Mendez (Community Based Organization).

Our participant numbers are rising with each meeting, but we are aiming to increase our meeting attendance even more! Our hope is to have over 100 participants attending each SLT Town Hall Meeting, similarly to our Curriculum Night Town Hall.

• Attendance Updates:

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- As many of our families are aware, attendance is a big deal this year! Currently, the overall attendance percentage for our BGES scholars from September 7, 2023 to today (September 19, 2023) is at 91%. The city's current overall attendance percentage is at 92%. We are almost tied with the city, which is big and amazing news!! However, 37% of our scholars are considered to be chronically absent already this school year. We want to ensure that students are attending school so our chronically absent student percentage decreases.

If families attended our Back to School Bash on August 30, 2023, the attendance category handout was provided. Families who attended the Back to School Bash should already be aware of what attendance category their child falls into.

We want all scholars' attendance to be in the green! We understand that things happen (i.e., emergencies, illness), but we want to continue to see improvements in attendance.

Important attendance percentages to remember:

- 96-100%: Scholars are not at risk for chronic absenteeism.
- 91-95%: Scholars are considered to be at risk of becoming chronically absent.
- 90% and Below: Scholars are considered to be **chronically absent**.

Remember Mr. Mendez's analogy: 85% on a test is great, but 85% attendance is not!


Reminder: Keeping attendance up-to-date is important for scholars to engage in core instruction!!


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School Assessment Updates:



This school year, we will be using three main assessments to analyze your scholars' growth throughout the year. Each assessment will be administered to scholars **3 times per year** (fall, winter, spring). The three assessments we will use are as follows:

- <u>Acadience:</u> This assessment is used with scholars in grades K-2 and it measures reading skills, including phonics and phonemic awareness. It is administered by the classroom teacher and is completed with one student at a time. The Acadience testing window is currently open and closes the last week of October. Lastly, teachers receive immediate results. We strongly encourage families to contact their scholars' teachers and request their Acadience test results.
- MAP Growth: The MAP Growth Assessment is a computer based assessment that measures student skills in both reading and math and is used with scholars in grades K-5. This assessment

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includes "in-the-moment" level adjustments to determine scholars' independent learning levels that are directly aligned to the Next Generation Learning Standards. The MAP Growth Assessment is not a timed assessment and it allows students the opportunity to take their time to work through each question or passage.

- Changes with MAP Growth Assessment Administration from the 2022-2023 school year: In
  the past, the MAP Growth was administered to the whole class by the teacher. After reflecting,
  this school year, scholars will be administered their MAP Growth in a small group, allowing the
  teacher to proctor and monitor students.
- Running Records: A running record is a measurement tool that measures scholars' understanding of concepts of print and reading fluency. During a running record, teachers listen to scholars read and respond to comprehension based questions. Running Records are performed by the teacher with one student at a time. This allows teachers to identify reading fluency and reading comprehension skills for each scholar, as well as identify both their instructional and independent reading levels.

Why do we administer these assessments?

 The assessment information provides teachers with individual student data, which informs them of small group instruction groupings, planning, and support. Teachers can plan based on individual student needs.

- Quick Afterschool Update:

The After School program will begin on Tuesday, September 26, 2023. The staff are excited to get to know your scholars, but ask that you please remain patient with them as they are still hiring staff members.

The After School program design will be different this year. We have many literacy activities planned as we want to ensure we are keeping with the continuity of the school day. We are actively hiring a literacy specialist to support your scholars in after school. Mr. Simeon is our Sports Specialist and your scholars

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have been very excited seeing him in the school building already! We are also offering Dance/Step and Homework Help!!
